Honorary Guest

We were greatly honoured by Professor Francesco Bandarin accepting our invitation and participate in the conference as its Honorary Guest but earlier this year he was called back by Irina Bokvova to the position of UNESCO Assistant Director-General for Culture in order to contribute in the establishment of measures for preserving heritage sites in war time. For this



reason, he is not able to appear in person but he has sent us a video message.

Francesco Bandarin, architect and planner, graduated in Architecture in Venice (1975) and in City and Regional Planning at the University of California, Berkeley (1977and has pursued an academic career as Professor of Urban Planning at University of Venice (IUAV) and professional career consultant as a for international organizations in the field of Urban Conservation and Development.

He served as Director of the UNESCO World Heritage Centre from September 2000 to March 2011. In his capacity as Director of the World

Heritage Centre, he is the Secretary of the World Heritage Committee. In the past years he has actively supported the reforms promoted by the World Heritage Committee to streamline the implementation of the World Heritage Convention, and has successfully promoted partnerships with Governments, NGOs and the private sector for the protection of World Heritage sites. He has actively supported the creation of World Heritage related initiatives and institutions in different parts of the world, such as in China, South Africa and Europe. Mr Bandarin has led the development of a vast network of public private partnerships for World Heritage conservation, as well as the development of a series of regional category II centres in every part of the world.

He was appointed UNESCO Assistant Director-General for Culture in May 2010 and worked there until July 2014. He was Director of the Italian Special Projects Office for the Safeguarding of Venice and its Lagoon, and Director of Special Programmes for the 2000 Jubilee Preparations in Rome. He has written numerous specialized publications and articles, and co-authored "The Historic Urban Landscape: Managing in an Urban Century", published in 2012.

Beside his UNESCO position he has been an Associate Professor in Urbanistic Technique and Planning of the University of Venice.

On Tuesday, the conference will be moved to the Hungarian Open Air Museum in Szentendre. Buses will depart from the University at 8:30 a.m. Expected arrival back to the university is 6 p.m.

Please do not forget your badge, it is necessary for the participation and the free move in the Open Air Museum area, including the free use of the museum train line.

Gala Dinner

The **Gala Dinner** will be held on **Fortuna Boat Hotel*** & Restaurant,** (H-1137, Szent István Park, alsó rakpart, Budapest, Hungary) at 8.00 p.m. on 15 June, 2016.

The restaurant is located between the Margaret Bridge and the Árpád Bridge, next to the Margaret Island on the Pest side of the Danube river.

There are a lot of public transportation stops located in the neighbourhood: the trolleys 75 and 76 stop at the Szent István Park. The trams 2, 4, 6 stop at Jászai Mari tér (Pest side of Margaret Bridge), and the boat hotel is for about 200 meters north from there.

From the University the easiest way is to take the Metro line 2 (red) at the Örs Vezér tere (5 minutes walk from the University). Change at Blaha Lujza tér (4th stop) to tram 4 or 6 on the surface towads Széll Kálmán tér. Travel to Jászai Mari tér (5th stop). Leaving the tram you will be facing north. The boat hotel is for about 200 meters north from there on the river bank.

Excursion to Pannonhalma

Millenary Benedictine Abbey of Pannonhalma and its Natural Environment

The first Benedictine monks settled here in 996. They went on to convert the Hungarians, to found the country's first school and, in 1055, to write the first document in Hungarian. From the time of its founding, this monastic community has promoted culture throughout central



Europe. Its 1,000-year history can be seen in the succession of architectural styles of the monastic buildings (the oldest dating from 1224), which still today house a secondary school and the monastic community. It has made tremendous development recently establishing a new visitor centre, thus protecting the arboretum and nature around the institution. They have a winery and vineyards becoming more and more famous by their outstanding quality wine. The

herbal garden developed some years ago produces a great number of health care and curing products that can be tasted and purchased there. Pannonhalma is an excellent example how a World Heritage Site can preserve the environment, the past, the traditions and transmit it to the youth and tourists in the same time or consequently staying economically solid.

- Guided tour in the Abbey and the Arboretum
- Lunch in the school of the Abbey
- Visit the Herbal Garden with tasting lavendel products
- Visit the Winery with wine tasting

Using public transport

Tickets for public transport

Public transport in the city is well-organized. Trams, buses, trolley buses and metro trains operate without conductors. Tickets must be purchased in advance at metro stations or mainly at vendor machines at the metro, tram and bus stops where you can pay by bank card or cash (Hungarian Forints).

When using single tickets, a new ticket has to be validated at the beginning of each journey and this is done by inserting it into the slot in the small red or orange boxes situated at waist height near the doors of buses, trolleybuses and trams trains. Please note that on the subway system, these boxes are in the stations at the top of the escalator. The inspectors can ask for checking the tickets and passes on any vehicle and anywhere in the Metro system, including after you have got off – so please, remember to validate your ticket and keep it until you leave the station!

Budapest has an excellent night bus system. Make sure that you have a ticket; the transport company (BKK) has hired uniformed security guards who check for tickets in the bus stops. It's no problem if you don't have a ticket, since the security staff has them on sale all night - just pay and ride.

Taxis

Taxis can be fast and cheap in the city, especially late at night when there is limited public transportation. Taxis can be hailed on the street (use only yellow cars!), but it is cheaper to call ahead of time. Residents in Budapest rarely flag down taxis in the street and our advice is to always call one of the recommended companies.
